



THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 73,639 for 120 acres, in favor of Laura Van Alstyne, widow of William Van Alstyne, Sergeant, Captain Reynolds's Company, New York Militia, War of 1812,

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South West quarter of the South East quarter and the South half of the South West quarter of Section twenty four, in Township sixty four, of Range thirty eight, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Plattsburg, Missouri, containing one hundred and twenty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Laura Van Alstyne to John J. Anderson, in whose favor said tract has been located:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John J. Anderson, as assignee as aforesaid, and to his heirs,

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John J. Anderson, as assignee as aforesaid, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
